
Formation: The Hall of Children's Health

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Children's Oral Health

CHI St. Joseph Children's Health launched Brush.Brush.Smile!® in 2004, but our journey was just beginning. Riding the mobile dental clinic into town, the first of our Lancaster County health heroes emerged.

In fiscal year 2015, 2,114 dental visits were provided to 1,143 **children** through the *Brush.Brush.Smile!*® Mobile Dental Program of CHI St. Joseph Children's Health. Cleanings, Screenings, X-Rays and, if needed, fillings and more. The care provided to children in our community had a value of over \$1,591,511!

The Brush.Brush.Smile!® Mobile Dental Clinic Program provides services on-site at all 16 Lancaster County School Districts. Throughout the year children are seen at over **60 different locations** in the community including elementary and middle schools, churches, local farms and community centers.

Each patient receives an initial cleaning, screening and exam With cavities common among children, the Brush.Brush.Smile!® dentists are able to address most dental needs identified during the exam right on the mobile dental clinic.

Opening soon, the **Columbia Dental Center** can be the dental home every child needs!



Good nutrition and oral health are key building blocks to good health. It can be tricky, especially today with so many food choices all around us. The Children's Health Educators of CHI St. Joseph Children's Health work to promote good habits and work with kids to get them to try healthy locally grown choices.

They offer programs in schools and community organizations throughout Lancaster County. Last year they provided oral health education to over 20% of all primary/elementary school-age kids in the community – 8,077 children.

This year CHI St. Joseph Children's Health will introduce a new member of the education team to the community – **Hank.** He'll help inspire healthy habits and healthy smiles across the Community.



Children's Access to Care

Good health for children is a long journey. Along the way each stop can have its own challenges. Finding and keeping insurance. Locating a doctor and seeing the doctor as often as you should. Taking care of your teeth and your eyes. Parents without insurance may face an awful financial choice: paying for a child's medication or basic needs like food or rent.

The Children's Health Advocates from CHI St. Joseph Children's Health can make the confusing make sense and help families navigate the healthcare system. We can help with an application for insurance, or help you find a doctor, dentist and even an eye doctor to care for your kids and they'll help you make the appointments.

In FY2015, 1,143 kids benefited from working with an Advocate from CHI St. Joseph Children's Health.

In FY2015 CHI St. Joseph Children's Health invested over \$100,000 in the first year of the program. Examples of our community investments include:

- Providing the essential information necessary to prevent disease
- Building the skills to recognize, respond and prevent domestic and dating violence
- Creating access to fresh fruits and vegetables
- Expanding the availability of children's mental health services
- Building the capacity of the community to respond to children's health needs

In 1883, two Women Religious from the Sisters of St. Francis of Philadelphia arrived in Lancaster County. Their mission was to care for the poor and vulnerable of the local community.

As others emerged to address the need for medical care, Catholic Health Initiatives embraced the spirit of our Founding Sisters and refocused its mission in Lancaster dedicating a new organization to meet the needs of the most vulnerable in the community - the children.

Community Initiatives

The health needs of children in Lancaster County go beyond the services and programs offered by CHI St. Joseph Children's Health in our community.

The Community Initiative Grant Program invests **10% of CHI** St. Joseph Children's Health's investment income each year in community programs and services dedicated to improve the health and well-being of children and families.

The program invests in **6 impact areas**: Children's Health and Well-being, Children's Oral Health, Childhood Immunizations, Lead Poisoning Prevention and Screening, Violence Prevention and Access to Care.
