Behavioral Health

We recognized the need for something to change in the behavioral health landscape for children of our community. The time had arrived for a new model of behavioral health services for children and families — a model of care focused as much on prevention as on treatment.

Driven by this one purpose and core belief, CHI St. Joseph Children's Health spent FY2017 designing a system, building a Center and assembling a team uniquely positioned and trained to be the one provider of family-focused behavioral health and psychiatric care in the Community.

Our first behavioral health center began walking with families as partners on their health journeys in August 2017.

Family Wellness Case Management

Life is easier with a partner. The case management department at CHI St. Joseph Children's Health has been walking in partnership with children and families in the Lancaster Community since 2015.

Working as a pair, parents/care givers and case managers strive to assure every child has access to the health services and benefits necessary to grow up healthy and happy.

During FY2016-2017, case managers provided over **25,231 units of services to children** and families throughout the Lancaster Community. Their partnerships with local families helped children access insurance benefits, primary care and dental care in addition to other health-related services.

Health Education

In a world with a millions of different choices and options, sometimes it is hard to figure out what's the healthiest choice. Education presents the keys to which good health is possible. At CHI St. Joseph Children's Health our children's health education philosophy is based upon four principles

- Engaging children and families through innovative and fun programs.
- Inspiring children and their families to recognize and embrace healthier choices.
- Motivating participants to incorporate healthy choices into their daily lives.
- Forming life-long healthy habits.

During FY2016-2017, **15,239 children and care givers** participated in our education programs.

Dental Services

Our success in improving the oral health of children throughout the Lancaster Community is driven by three keys essential to un-locking healthy smiles.

Education – We educate families as to the importance of dental care from the time a child's first tooth appears.

2. Access – Our Dental Centers provide many families with the first dental homes for their children. The Centers provide dental care to children regardless of their insurance status or ability to pay.

3. **Consistency** – Getting regular dental care – including an exam every six months – is essential to maintaining a healthy smile.

During FY2016-2017, the Columbia Dental Center completed **4,402** dental visits caring for over **1,600** children in the community.

Community Initiatives

Through our Community Initiative Grant Program for FY 2016-2017, CHI St. Joseph Children's Health awarded over \$193,100 to community-based organization in the Lancaster Community to improve the health and well-being of children and families.

Healthy Columbia programming is designed to provide the opportunities and the supports necessary to create a healthy and thriving community.


